Regulating AntiDiscrimination and AntiRacism

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From hate speech to hate communication How racism is produced and reflected through communication practices

2 RADAR PILOT WORKSHOPS in 6 countries between April and June 2016

Two 16-hour workshops are offered free of charge in 6 different countries as the result from RADAR - Regulating AntiDiscrimination and AntiRacism (Fundamental Rights and Citizenship Programme JUST/2013/FRAC/AG/6271)

The overall objective of the workshops consists in acquiring competencies in **Anti-hate communication in an intercultural perspective**.



The training is intended to be delivered as a workshop in which all trainees will bring in their expertise from different points of view: as lawyers, judges, law enforcement personnel, people who have experienced racism, people who have experienced hate crime (in particular people from other countries), intercultural mediators working with people who have experienced hate crime, teachers, social workers, journalists and others.

No particular pre-requisites for trainees are required, although it would be preferable if they are able to work on the RADAR electronic platform (downloading material for reflection and exercise and uploading it in the Dropbox)¹.

A self-assessment for trainees can be carried out on the basis of the LEVEL5® self-assessment system².

In order to guarantee interaction and learning from each other, the workshops are organised in two different groups of maximum 15 participants each:

One group targets mainly
LEGAL PROFESSIONALS AND LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICIALS WORKING IN THE FIELD OF RACISM AND XENOPHOBIA

The other group targets mainly
POTENTIAL OR ACTUAL VICTIMS OF HATE CRIME, IN PARTICULAR MIGRANTS

For both groups are invited as well
journalist, politicians, social workers, religious communities, adult educators, teaching staff of secondary schools and university, academics, migrants' associations, migrants and in general any kind of adolescent and adult citizens, personnel from ministries (Ministry of Internal Affairs, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Foreign Affairs), personnel from embassies and consulates, representatives from EU institutions (European Commission, European Council, European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights).
